#### **About this project**

The Stars Appeal Neonatal Family Accommodation Unit provides a home-from-home for families whilst their premature or critically ill new baby stays on the hospital's Neonatal Unit. We also fund the latest equipment to help the Neonatal Unit team provide the best possible care to fragile young lives.

We aim to raise £50,000 over the next year to keep funding this important work and give local babies, born prematurely or critically ill, the best possible start in life.



## "You help make the Children's Ward fabulous"

"It was the Easter holidays. Torri was quite tired, her chest was hurting and she became paler and paler. We went to Salisbury Hospital for a blood test. By 4pm that afternoon I was asked what I knew about leukaemia. It was a massive shock

We've been in and out of the Children's Ward for the last 18 months. The extras the Stars Appeal provides are really important. We always have a comfortable room, with its own bathroom and a fabulous parent's bed for me so I can be there for her day and night and not have to worry about leaving her.

The whole ward is made to look bright and joyful. When you've been in hospital for a long time, this really lifts your spirits. It allows children to be children and makes them happy and smile.

Torri uses the Stars Appeal free Wi-Fi a lot. It means she can still have contact with her school friends and see what they're doing whilst she's in hospital for up to two weeks at a time. It's a link to normality for her.

Like most people, we're more used to giving to charity than being helped. But now we've had that role reversed which can happen to anybody. Thank you is a word that is said and bandied around, but it means so much. It is just so humbling the lengths that people go to to support the Stars Appeal to help people in our situation. It's nothing short of amazing."

## "The equipment your donations fund is really, really important to people like me"



"I'd been repeatedly ill for about two years. No one knew what was wrong. But then I got referred for an MRI scan at Salisbury Hospital. It showed I had a brain tumour.

It's very, very hard. And it's life changing. I'm not allowed to drive. Walking is difficult because of my balance, I get really worn out. Sometimes even talking is a struggle.

The equipment the Stars Appeal funds is really, really important, especially as it often means people can be treated locally and not have to travel elsewhere, and they don't have to wait as long. I've had all my scans at Salisbury Hospital. Every time I go in I feel a lot more comfortable there than I would in another hospital, the staff are amazing."

### **About this project**

Every year, the Stars Appeal aims to fund at least £500,000 worth of state-of-the-art treatment and diagnostic equipment to help hardworking medical staff provide patients with the very best possible care here at their local hospital. Examples include an anti-gravity treadmill for rehabilitation, a 3D cone beam head scanner for Oral Maxillo Facial Surgery, a topographer machine in the Eye Clinic, the Cardiac Suite and the second CT and MRI scanners. ## "Thank you for giving me some freedom"

"On a boiling hot day at Weymouth Beach with my friends, I dived unknowingly into shallow water, breaking my neck and paralysing myself from my chest to my toes. I've been in the Spinal Centre at Salisbury Hospital for over a year.

Soon after being admitted to Salisbury, I met Sonya and Jo, the two ladies that work for the Stars Appeal's Spinal Centre Recreation project. They take patients like me out on day trips to see the outside world and to give us a sense of freedom again, which when you're spending months in hospital is massively needed, trust me. I have been lucky enough to watch Southampton play football twice, go to Twickenham to watch England hammer France in the Six Nations and visit the Hawk Conservancy and Haynes Motor Museum. They don't only do day trips, they also organise activities and social events like barbecues, hog roasts, cream teas, ploughman's lunches and bacon rolls, all home cooked and served on the ward!

I remember the first trip they took me on. It was scary going out for the first time in a wheelchair. I thought people would look at me differently but actually you realise people are kind and helpful. I felt relieved, the pressure had been taken off of me. It made me feel relaxed about getting out and about again."

Stars Appeal funded Recreational Assistants, Sonya and Jo, work with patients in the Spinal Centre, who will often be in hospital for over six months, enabling them to spend precious time away from the hospital and with family and friends. Over 120 patients are helped each year. We urgently need to raise £45,000 to continue funding this important project.

"I've been in hospital for a long time, nearly two months. I fell and had a knock on the head, so I've been a bit on the poorly side.

It's lovely when the musicians come to the ward. I love music of all kinds, I've never been able to sing in my life but when they asked me to join in I said 'yes, I certainly will!' We

sang and we laughed and it was wonderful. Everybody in the ward enjoys the music, and the thought of them coming gives us something to look forward to. Sometimes the Stars Appeal people even take us for coffee in the hospital canteen. We meet patients from other wards and have a nice chat. The way the hospital has treated me has been
